The Morehouse School of Medicine is the proud recipient of a \$1.5 million HRSA Federal Grant for Primary Care Training and Enhancement. This grant enables our PA Leadership (PALS) program to incentivize physicians and practicing physician assistants. Preceptors joining the program receive numerous benefits, including a \$2000 stipend.

Minorities represent less than 5% of certified PAs in the United States. The PALS program aims to increase diversity and inclusivity within the medical profession by actively recruiting underrepresented minorities and veterans from rural and underserved areas.

As a PALS preceptor, you will have the opportunity to share your knowledge and mentor a new generation of PA students in a clinical setting.

PALS preceptors will also combine behavioral health and primary care through MAT-Waiver Training, which uses medication, counseling, and skills development to improve treatment

outcomes for opioid patients.

Our goal is to inspire PA students to enter primary care practices in underserved communities and improve service to these vulnerable groups.
